Thank you for your interest in our job advertisement. Protecting your personal data is important to us. Therefore, we would like to inform you about how we collect, process and use your data as part of the application process, pursuant to **Art. 13 GDPR**.

3. Processing purpose

We process your personal data for the purpose of assessing applications for possible employment or co-operation with the company. As part of the application process, we process the data you provide. These may include general personal data, such as your name, address, details of your professional qualifications and school education, or details of continuing professional education or other information that you provide to us in connection with your application.

Any further processing of your data will only take place with your consent. The purpose in this case is to build up a pool of applicants to fill vacancies following the regular application procedure.

4. Legal basis for processing

The legal basis for processing the data you have provided is **Art. 6(1)(b)** and **Art. 6(1)(a) GDPR**.

5. Sources and origin of your data

We receive the necessary data directly from you as the data subject.

6. Service providers and systems to safeguard the processing of data

We do not use any job-application or HR software to manage the application process. You send us your application documents by email. If applicable, the application will then be forwarded, also by email, to the relevant department and division managers.

You will also be added to our applicant pool, which is also managed via our email software, once you have given your active consent.

We use Microsoft Outlook to receive, send and manage emails.

As the security of your personal data is important to us, we have signed a data processing agreement with the above-mentioned company.

7. Recipients of your personal data

Your personal data will only be transferred internally to employees who are responsible for the data as part of the application process. All employees are required to protect the confidentiality of your data.

In principle, your personal data will not be transferred externally unless we are legally authorised to do so.

8. Decision-making including profiling

There are no automated individual decision-making procedures pursuant to **Art. 22 GDPR** or other profiling measures in the sense of **Art. 4 No. 4 GDPR**.

9. Transfer to third countries

Your data will only be processed within the European Union. There will be no transfer outside the European Union. We will inform you in advance if this should become necessary and will ensure that all necessary measures are taken to maintain an appropriate level of data protection.

10. Data retention and erasure

Lawmakers have enacted a number of retention periods, which we observe with the utmost care in order to comply with these obligations. In this context, we generally store your personal data only for as long as the stated purpose allows, or as required by law for reasons of proof. We store the data collected in connection with your application for a maximum of 6 months after the application process has been completed. Once this period has elapsed, the data collected in connection with the application will be erased or blocked if erasure is not possible.

Storing the data beyond this period is only possible with your consent or legal permission.

11. Rights of the data subject

As data subject, you have the following rights:

- Right of access (Art. 15 GDPR)
- Right to rectification (Art. 16 GDPR)
- Right to erasure (Art. 17 GDPR)
- Right to restriction of processing (Art. 18 GDPR)
- Right to notification (Art. 19 GDPR)
- Right to data portability (Art. 20 GDPR)
- Right to object (Art. 21 GDPR)
- Right to withdraw consent (Art. 22 GDPR)
- Right to lodge a complaint (Art. 77 GDPR)

If you have given us consent to process your data, you can withdraw this at any time with effect for the future. Withdrawal will not affect the lawfulness of processing before the withdrawal. All you need to do is send an informal email to: privacy@ogl-digital.com

12. Competent state data protection authority

Information on lodging a complaint with a supervisory authority

If you consider that the processing of your personal data by us infringes the GDPR, you have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority - in particular in the member state of your habitual residence, place of work or place of alleged infringement - without prejudice to any other administrative or judicial remedy.
